Why were the Marshall Islands built?

Naval Base Marshall Islands were United States Navy advance bases built on the Marshall Islands during World War II to support the Pacific War efforts. The bases were built by US Navy after the Marshall Islands campaign that captured the islands from the Empire of Japan. By February 1944 the United States Armed Forces had captured the islands.

Does the US have a military base in the Marshall Islands?

The base's lease until 2066 ensures long-term U.S. presence, supporting the Compact of Free Association. U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll is the only U.S. military base in the Marshall Islands, spanning 5.6 square miles across 100 islands, with Kwajalein Island as the largest at 3.5 miles long.

How will the US help the Marshall Islands?

Enhancing Connectivity and Resilience: In coordination with Taiwan and the Marshall Islands, the U.S. Department of State is providing \$8.3 million to help replace Air Marshall Islands' aging fleet and provide disaster relief capacity and connectivity to outer islands, including Kwajalein Atoll, where the United States has critical military assets.

What is the largest military base in the Marshall Islands?

U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll is the only U.S. military base in the Marshall Islands, spanning 5.6 square miles across 100 islands, with Kwajalein Island as the largest at 3.5 miles long. It hosts one of four global GPS ground stations and the world's largest lagoon at 1,125 square miles.
